Dr Pierre Rieben, Director of the Vincent Merle Success Network at the National Conservatory of Arts and Crafts (CNAM), member of the Scientific and Pedagogical Council (CSP) of the Vaucanson School.





Mrs Edith Cresson, president of Fondation des Ecoles de la 2ème chance, Former Prime Minister (1991-1992), European Commissioner (1994-1999). She is a politician born in 1934. She graduated at Ecole des hautes etudes commerciales jeunes filles, and holds a PhD in demography. She was an economist engineer in several survey firms, a member of the Convention des Institutions républicaines (1966-71), in charge of the organisation of youth and students at the Secrétariat National du parti socialiste (1974), Mayor of Thuré (1977), Member of the European Parliament (1979-1981), MP for Vienne (1981), Minister of Agriculture (1981-83), Minister for Foreign Trade and Tourism (1983-84), Minister of Industrial Redeployment and External Trade (1984-86), General councilor (1982), Mayor (1983-97), Deputy Mayor (1997-2008) of Châtellerault, MP for Vienne (1986-88), President of Club France exporte plus (1987-91), President of Association démocratique des Français à l'étranger (ADFE) (1988-90), Member of the Secrétariat national du parti socialiste (1987), Minister of European Affairs (1988-90), CEO of Schneider industries services international (1990-91), Prime Minister (1991-92), President of Service, industries, strategies, international et environnement (Sisie) (1992-94) of Institute for European Studies (1992), European Commissioner for research, technological development, education, training and youth (1994-99), President of the Fondation des écoles de la 2e chance (since 2001), Consultant to the Agency for the Distribution of Technological Information (ADIT) (2008).

















Dr Bénédicte Halba, president of iriv, director of iriv conseil, initiator and French partner of the JuCiVol project. In 1997, Bénédicte Halba created iriv for which she is responsible for studies, for training programmes, for

publications and through iriv conseil as well as the implementations of the websites: iriv www.iriv.net, the iriv publications portal- www.iriv-publications.net, and a website on promoting the benefits of volunteering experience - www.iriv-vaeb.net . Since 2004, she has published a biannual electronic journal - www.benevolat.net and a newsletter on migration since 2016- cross-views on migration. The pioneering VAEB project (2003-2006) that she initiated and led in 7 European countries, which won an award in Helsinki in 2006, led to the recognition of volunteering as an example of non-formal and informal learning during the European Year of Volunteering in 2011. She has been teaching at the University since 2000 in France and in Europe. She was responsible for coordinating the theoretical content of training for young people and tutoring for professionals. She organised the experimentation of the JuCiVol project in France through the use of her Ile-de-France network, with the Centre de Ressources Politique de la Ville en Essonne (CRPVE) and by teaming up with the Cité Saint Pierre in Lourdes (Secours catholique) and the local Mission Hautes Pyrénées. She organised the final conference at the CNAM involving her European colleagues in Spain, Cyprus, Italy and Slovenia.

Mrs Annette-Laure Makongo, holds Management and International Trade- Americas (University of Paris Creteil), and specialized in the Latin-American area. In the second year of

her bachelor's degree, she completed an internship in a Spanish event company in Malaga (Spain). For her second year of Master's degree, she completed a six-month internship in a company in Madrid. For JuCiVol she has compiled a list of 100 contacts in Ile de France (youth leaders, local missions, PIJ...) and organised a series of meetings in the field (Seine Saint Denis, Val de Marne, Essonne and Hauts de Seine). In charge of meeting with key actors in Île-de-France for Iriv. She participated in the iriv club at the Cité des métiers. She has also worked on the Schola and EducOpera projects which are designed to promote

the involvement of young people in voluntary and extracurricular activities.

















Dr Monica Ibanez, University of Burgos (Spain), She is the PI of the Project Jucivol. PhD in Anthropology (1999) at the University of

Chicago and currently professor of Sociology at the University of Burgos. Her research focuses on the construction of social imaginaries and the ways in which these constructions affect the everyday life of a given social group. She has studied these issues from different perspectives (Basque nationalism, Bulgarian transnational migrants) while maintaining a strong emphasis on migration. She has been the director of several national research projects dealing with social and labour integration of transnational migrants, and has participated in the past years as a researcher in other European and national projects. She has presented her work in national (Spanish) and international conferences and has published two books and numerous articles on migration in national and international editorials (Routledge, Paradigm, Palgrave). In addition, she is a member of several international associations, such as ISA, ECPR, and IMISCOE among others and she has been peer reviewer of several academic publications. Since October 2015 to date she is also a member of the National Agency for the Evaluation of the Quality in Higher Education (ANECA) working in the Social Sciences Commission in charge of evaluating academic degrees in Spanish universities.

Mrs Laura Kossi, is director of the Resource Centre of the Urban Policy in Essonne (CRPVE) which is a forum for reflection and exchange at the service of the stakeholders in city policy. She deals with educational issues, urban renewal, health, migration issues, etc. Each year, the CRPVE proposes a programme that must respond to the needs of stakeholders involved in urban policy in the districts in question for skills development, networking and exchanges.















Anciens Volontaires de Service Civique (ANAVSC) in Les Mureaux (Yvelines). A student in Applied Foreign Languages (intercultural dynamics section), he arrived in France in 2013. He is involved in the associative world to continue a work initiated in Senegal in his district and his school. First as a volunteer, then as part of a civic service programm with the Racivs (Network of Associations for International Cooperation of the Val de Seine) he founded the Association Nationale des Anciens Volontaires de Service Civique. He still contributes to the activities of the association of nationals of his hometown in Senegal. His Master 2 thesis was devoted to civic engagement and the living together - his association, ANAVSC, co-organized the 3rd edition of the Day of Living Together which brought together more than 600 people at Les Mureaux.



Mr Gonzague Amyot d'Inville, Dinerre in Lourdes. This facility of the Secours Catholique - Carita cial accommodation structure for adults and families in difficulty. The field of health and higher education in Nantes, he took over

Mr Gonzague Amyot d'Inville, Director of the Cité Saint-Pierre in Lourdes. This facility of the Secours Catholique - Caritas France association is a social accommodation structure for adults and families in difficulty. After a 12-year career in the field of health and higher education in Nantes, he took over responsibility for this international reception and entertainment centre in 2012. Unique in its kind, Cité Saint-Pierre bears a significant contribution in helping people in precarious situations, and is a forum for multi-cultural, intergenerational and inter-religious exchange. Every year more than 70,000 people from all over the world - including 20,000 people experiencing poverty - stay there. A team of 30 employees supports the 1,300 people in the service that operates it (500 beds, 66,000 overnight stays and 160,000 meals served each year). Since he took up his position, Gonzague Amyot d'Inville has developed partnerships to open up his institution more widely to voluntary and voluntary commitments for young people from all walks of life. Gonzague Amyot d'Inville is currently training as a Director of the Social Intervention School at the Pau Social Work Institute. He came into contact with Iriv as he was involved in a study conducted during this training.



















Mr Lilian Caussade, Coordinator Lourdes, Vallée des Gaves, Integration Advisor, Local Mission of the Hautes-Pyrénées, Antenne Lourdes, has been working for 25 years within the Local Mission of the Hautes-Pyrénées. For 15 years he has been leading projects within the framework of the Urban Policy on the Agglomerations of Tarbes and Lourdes. In the spirit of social engineering cherished by Bertrand SCHWARTZ and the Réseau des Missions locales, he participates in the development of projects based on the voluntary actions of young people that promote creativity, expression and citizenship. In joint construction with partners in the field and young people, he uses media such as group workshops, video testimonial collections, neighbourhood newspapers and civic service devices to reinvent the operational aspects of ongoing projects. According to him, local Missions are the seeds for the development of young people's personal skills and for revealing the potential of their integration paths.





Mr Philippe DEBRUYNE, Confederal Secretary CFDT in charge of securing pathways through skills development and vocational training, he is President of the National Interprofessional Joint

Committee for Employment and Training (Copanef) and Vice-President of the National Council for Employment, Training and Vocational Guidance (Cnefop). As a former journalist, he was from 2001 to 2007 Vice-President and then President of Médiafor, OPCA de la Presse (now merged with Afdas), on behalf of the Fédération Communication, Conseil, Culture (F3C) CFDT, of which he was assistant secretary-general until 2008. He then worked in the consulting firms Ithaque and Syndex. Philippe Debruyne holds an executive master's degree in training management (EMMF) from the University of Paris-Dauphine.
